**Transference and Countertransference in

A One Day Workshop, March 21st 2012

From Freud's earliest formulations concerning patients' transference experiences to contemporary notions of an intertwined transference-countertransference field, this aspect of the patient-therapist relationship has been an ongoing focus of debate and controversy within the psychoanalytic movement. Any clinician attempting more intensive, psychoanalytically oriented treatment must be conversant with the full range of thinking about the nature of transference and countertransference in order adequately to be equipped to understand the complexities of a therapeutic relationship.

**Treatment of the Borderline Personality

The borderline concept has a long and controversial history in both psychiatry and psychoanalysis. The term itself, suggesting an intermediate area of psychopathology, belongs historically neither to the language of traditional psychiatry nor to the vocabulary of psychoanalysis. Nevertheless, the term has become very common over the past 25 years and has entered the most widely used psychiatric diagnostic manual as one of several severe personality disorders.

Dr. Graham Kavanagh is a licensed psychologist and certified psychoanalyst. In addition to being in private practice in Manhattan since 1985, Dr. Kavanagh is a supervisor of psychotherapy in the Doctoral Clinical Psychology program at Columbia University. He is also both teaching faculty and supervisor of psychotherapy at the William Alanson White Institute of Psychiatry, Psychoanalysis and Psychology and was formerly Director Emeritus and Training and Supervising Analyst at the Long Island Institute of Psychoanalysis and Psychotherapy.

From 2004 to 2009 Dr. Kavanagh was Senior Lecturer and Supervisor in the Beijing Psychoanalytic Training Project at Beijing Institute of Technology, where he is an Honorary Professor. He has also been a guest lecturer at Peking University, South Western Normal University and Fudan University.

Indeed, the exploration of this field of mutual influence has become the single most important factor in distinguishing psychoanalytically oriented therapies from other forms of psychotherapeutic intervention.

This one day workshop will begin with a morning lecture presentation that traces the development of theories about transference and countertransference from Freud through to contemporary Interpersonal Psychoanalysis. A comparative approach to different theories will be used to highlight the implications of the therapist's theoretical position for actual clinical work with patients.

In the afternoon session, clinical material presented by class participants will be used to illustrate the theories outlined in the morning lecture.

Despite its widespread use, however, clinicians have continued to disagree over whether the term describes a state, a personality organization, or a syndrome. Regardless of the difficulties involved in definition, the borderline concept is widely used and has been seen by some clinicians as "the problem of our age," in the same way that the hysteric was the problem of Freud's time. The morning session of the workshop will elucidate the borderline concept in terms of the following dichotomies: the differing approaches of psychiatry and psychoanalysis; the issue of whether borderline patients display a personality disorder or a less severe psychosis; finally, whether borderline disturbance is primarily a disorder of ego functioning or interpersonal relations. The session will conclude with a review of treatment considerations.

In the afternoon session, clinical material presented by class participants will be used to illustrate the theories and questions outlined in the morning lecture.
